Top private aviation firm refreshes identity, reaffirms commitment to members

Waterford, Mich. - (26 January 2008) - Southeast Michigan's premier supplier of private aviation services, Tradewinds Aviation Inc. of Waterford, Michigan is changing its name to Corporate Eagle Management Service, Inc. The organization, headed by former Pilot and Businessman Rick Nini, has changed its name to better reflect its service and vision for the future.

In addition to the name change, the company has decided to divest its flight training operation, the Tradewinds Aviation Pilot Center, to allow Corporate Eagle to target its resources and focus solely on providing the best private flight department services for its members. Corporate Eagle has a fleet of 11 aircraft and currently services 31 Southeastern Michigan members in the program.

"Although we are extremely proud of our achievements in the Pilot Center Operations, we will be divesting this portion of our business as of the first quarter 2008," said Nini, president & CEO. "With this change, our experienced and dedicated team will bring its laser-like focus to providing the finest services ever for our King Air and Hawker partnership program."

Corporate Eagle will maintain its headquarters in Michigan but is expanding to include a new satellite facility at St. Petersburg-Clearwater International Airport. Nini expects the new facility to be in operation by Fall 2008.

In 1982, Tradewinds Aviation, Inc. was formed to take over a failing flight school. With a passion for excellence, a team of dedicated professionals upgraded the fleet, the staff, the processes and systems. Over the years, the Tradewinds Aviation Pilot Center grew into a top-flight operation and the largest provider in Southeast Michigan. Today, the company offers members the opportunity to purchase or lease shares of its private jet fleet. Comparative to a timeshare on a high-end residential condo, Corporate Eagle - headquartered at the Oakland County International Airport - offers a fractional jet ownership program in which members may enjoy private air travel experiences by purchasing or leasing shares of King Air or Hawker business aircraft.
